Career Planning and Exploration

myStrategic Compass includes a personalized electronic counseling tool with self-surveys, career profiles and workplace value indicators. It asks learners to reflect on their findings, helping to fine tune career searches. By comparing these interests against various occupations and job outlooks, myStrategic Compass generates a list of matching career and potential education pathways. Upon exploration, learners are able to identify the foundational skills required for desired opportunities.

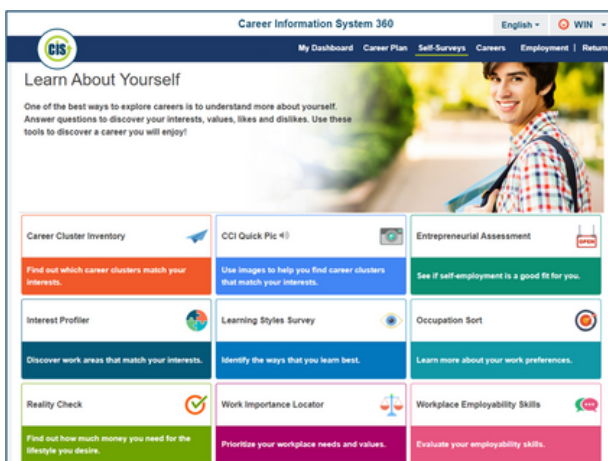

Learners can also utilize the Reality Check tool to forecast how their lifestyle plans and career choices will come together and create a budget based on their career interest, salary, region, and the local cost of living.



my Strategic Compass

myStrategic Compass is designed for learners of all ages to help identify the careers that best suit their interests, skills, values, and goals. The interactive career planning program encourages learners to enter their individual preferences to find matching careers aligned to interest, skill, and work. Then, it provides important information about those careers such as the education and skill levels required and economic and labor forecasts. This helps learners understand the academic pathways required to get them to their career choice. Giving learners pertinent real-world information ensures that they remain engaged and motivated through graduation and beyond.

Learners begin their use of myStrategic Compass with their dashboard. There are four tabs in the dashboard: Favorites, Self-Survey Results, Reports, and Best Career Matches, that learners can select to display specific information.



Favorites displays lists of careers, programs of study, schools, and more that learners have marked as their favorites.

Self-Survey Results displays an overview of the results of each survey the learner has completed.

Reports displays a list of self-surveys, favorites, and career plans that learners can select to export to a PDF document.

Best Career Matches displays a list of recommended careers based on a learner's self-survey results.

Occupations

Learners can find preparation requirements, wages, licensing requirements, and resources that can provide additional guidance for career-related learning.

Occupation Sort: Learners complete a survey to create a list of occupations that match work factors that are important to them, such as travel, wages, and advancement opportunities.

Education

Schools & Programs of Study: Learners can compare schools, including admissions requirements, costs, and program information.

Scholarships & Financial Aid: Learners can view tuition and financial aid information by school and browse a database of scholarships and grants.

Application Tracker: Learners can track their scholarship and school application progress.

Employment

Resume: Learners complete a job application data sheet that can be transformed into a resume and exported to a PDF or Word document.

Job Searching: Learners can access the US National Labor Exchange to view job openings across the country.

Job Success: Learners can access skill-building activities and content to develop good work habits.

Informal Assessments

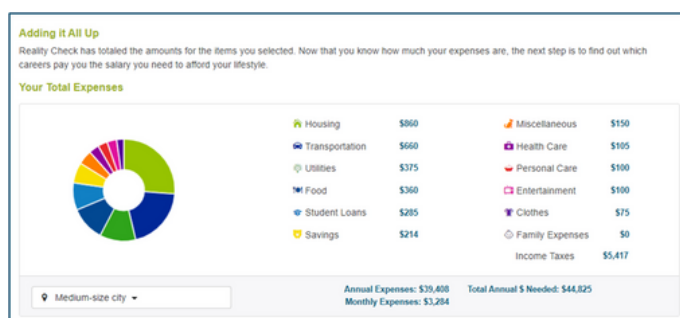
Learning Styles: Learners identify their personal learning style and how to enhance study skills.

Reality Check is a budgeting tool that offers learners the opportunity to match jobs and lifestyles, creating a deeper understanding of and appreciation for the links between education, careers, and life ahead.



Self-Surveys

Career Cluster Inventory: Learners answer questions to match their interests and activities they enjoy to occupations in the 16 national career clusters.

Interest Profiler: Learners rate their interest in specific activities to generate a list of occupations that best fit them.

Work Importance Locator: Learners rank twenty different work values such as achievement, independence, and working conditions to find occupations that best match the needs and values most important to them.
